## How well did you do as an evangelizing disciple? Review your day. Make sure you did at least one activity in each of the three areas of evangelization today.

HEAL	<ul> <li>How can we, as disciples, embrace our imperfections and sinfulness as a path to reuniting ourselves with those who feel excluded from the Church?</li> <li>Did I invite someone to join in a group that I am a part of?</li> <li>Did welcome interruptions or complaints from others?</li> <li>Did I listen attentively to other people's stories?</li> <li>Did I seek to recognize the suffering behind a person's words and actions?</li> <li>Did I show someone in a time of need that I am there for them?</li> <li>Did I stand up against someone who excluded or insulted others?</li> <li>Did I practice a corporal or spiritual work of mercy?</li> <li>Did I talk about a specific "inevitable event" at my parish?</li> <li>Did I remind myself, today, that I am loved by God?</li> <li>Was I open to others about who I really am or shut myself off in fear of rejection?</li> <li>Did I engage in conversation with someone today who I do not always get along with?</li> </ul>
PROCLAIM	<ul> <li>Did I share a personal story that expresses God's love for me?</li> <li>Did I show someone why we believe what we believe?</li> <li>When I talked about religion, did I make it clear that Jesus loves us, he died for us, and he is with us today?</li> <li>Did I read or share a story about the saints in order to show the power of sacrificial love?</li> <li>Did I proclaim the power of sacrificial love in the way I lived today?</li> <li>Did I live a life of "evangelical simplicity" today?</li> <li>Did I make sacrifices for others with the "joy of the Gospel"?</li> <li>Did I put the glory of God before my own desire for glory?</li> <li>In my preaching and teaching today, did I share a simple, easy-to-remember message?</li> <li>Did I practice what I preach today?</li> <li>Did I seek the help of the Holy Spirit in my ministry and outreach today?</li> </ul>
TEACH	<ul> <li>Did I encourage someone to <i>want</i> to learn more about the Catholic faith?</li> <li>Did I encourage someone to ask honest questions about our beliefs or did I provide black and white answers?</li> <li>Did I encourage my own curiosity and research answers to theological questions?</li> <li>Did I seek to make disciples or theologians in they way that I taught today?</li> <li>Did I talk about God as an abstract idea or someone with whom we can have a relationship?</li> <li>If I taught a lesson today, did I clearly choose between an inductive or deductive approach?</li> <li>In responding to opposition to Catholic teachings, did I courageously defend the faith without getting defensive?</li> </ul>
